

TIMELINE ON ORGAN DONATION EFFORTS BY LONGO

Efforts made to donate both while alive and after execution as well as to raise awareness for organ donations from prisoners.

- **7/29/09 - INITIAL REQUEST TO MAKE A LIVING DONATION**
 - Informed by DOC on 10/3/10 living donations were allowable to “established family members only.”
- **10/3/09 - INFORMED DOC ADMINISTRATION OF INTENT**
 - Detailed Longo’s intent to pursue organ donation while living and after execution with Oregon Department of Corrections administration.
- **10/15/09 - LETTER WRITING/EMAIL CAMPAIGN/RESEARCH**
 - Longo began campaign to research & determine the feasibility, challenges & possibilities of organ donation.
 - Continuing effort of writing government agencies (local & national), transplant banks, hospitals, law schools, organ donation advocates, prisoner rights groups, potential recipients, etc.
 - Hundreds of letters/emails sent. Thousands of pages of research & responses gathered.
- **11/1/09 - G.A.V.E. FOUNDED (GIFTS OF ANATOMICAL VALUE FROM EVERYONE)**
- **11/4/09 - LAUNCHED GAVELIFE.ORG**
 - Website set up to begin raising awareness, discussing challenges and gauging interest for prisoner organ donations.
- **12/14/09 – ESQUIRE HITS NEWSSTANDS**
 - In depth article by Michael Finkel in January 2010 issue of Esquire detailing Longo’s crime and previously un-submitted facts. Also discussed G.A.V.E., organ donation advocacy and donation intentions.
- **12/16/09 – LOCAL MEDIA NOTICE**
 - Oregonian, Statesman Journal, Local Oregon & Michigan TV Stations begin reporting on Longo’s organ donation advocacy and intentions of donating upon execution.
- **12/16/09 – D.O.C. DRUG TEST**
 - Oregon Department of Corrections begins retaliatory measures by submitting Longo to first Urinary Analysis since incarceration (April ’03) on the day that his face begins appearing on the front page of local newspapers announcing intentions (December ’09). Staff acknowledge that the UA was an emergency request from administration and not part of the random computerization and it was administered by in building staff instead of the dedicated UA staff.
- **2/9/10 - DOCUMENTARY PARTICIPATION**
 - Longo began participation in an upcoming documentary by Animus/Serena Films investigating the challenges and feasibility of prisoner organ donations as a possible solution to the organ crisis in the US.
 - Additionally, Longo has begun participation in a documentary by French documentarian Olivier Monot regarding Longo and the NYTimes author whose identity Longo stole while on the run for his crimes. GAVE’s efforts are to be included.
- **6/8/10 - PROPOSAL FOR ORGAN DONATION AFTER EXECUTION**
 - Submitted official proposal to Oregon Department of Corrections Director Max Williams to allow for organ donation upon Longo’s execution.
 - Received response dated 6/21/10 stating that DOC and the Department of Justice were reviewing proposal.
 - Denied by Max Williams on 10/26/10.

- **6/14/10 - PETITIONS TO AMEND OREGON ADMINISTRATIVE RULES**
 - Filed official petitions to amend prison related administrative rules to allow for organ donations from willing prisoners.
 - Involved rule amendments for living donors & donations after execution, including adoption of the recent one-drug lethal injection protocols.
 - ODOC denied the petitions on 9/22/10.
- **7/15/10 - PROPOSAL FOR LIVING PRISONER DONATIONS**
 - Submitted official proposal to Oregon Department of Corrections Director Max Williams to allow for living donation from Longo now.
 - Received response dated 7/29/10 stating that DOC and the Department of Justice were reviewing proposal.
 - Denied by Max Williams on 10/26/10.
- **7/30/10 - LETTER TO AG'S OFFICE**
 - Letter to Attorney General John Kroger making clear Longo's intentions to face death sentence as soon as organ donation after execution is allowed.
- **9/9/10 - LETTER TO JUDGE DICKEY**
 - Letter to Marion County Judge Dickey making clear Longo's intentions to face death sentence as soon as organ donation after execution is allowed.
- **9/22/10 - PETITIONS TO AMEND ODOC ADMINISTRATIVE RULES DENIED**
 - After receiving many responses, all in favor of the rule amendments, including many from death row and the public, DOC denied the petitions on 9/22/10 stating, *"The Department finds that the interests of the public and condemned inmates are best served by denying the petition(s)"*.
 - There was nothing informative within the response to clarify why the petitions were denied.
- **9/26/10 - FOLLOW-UP LETTER SENT TO MAX WILLIAMS REGARDING OUTSTANDING PROPOSALS**
 - Letter sent requesting an additional response on the proposals. The proposals were submitted separately intentionally to elicit responses from ODOC as to whether they would consider making an exception to the rules or to allow within the constraints of current ODOC rules.
- **10/21/10 - HEARING WITH JUDGE DICKEY**
 - Hearing called by Marion County Circuit Judge Dickey to discover Longo's intentions regarding foregoing appeals & organ donations.
 - Attorney General's representative, Kethleen Cegla, tells the court she understood that ODOC had already stated that they would not allow any organ donations upon execution wishes.
 - In an effort to clarify matters, Longo voiced to the court that ODOC had only responded to the petitions to amend rules and not to the proposals to allow for donations within the bounds of rules already established.
- **10/26/10 - MAX WILLIAMS REJECTS PROPOSALS**
 - ODOC Director finally responds to proposals after court hearing makes organ donation intentions public. Instead of responding to the proposals themselves, as OSP administration verified was the original intent and that they were currently working on, ODOC uses the AG's court response to state that they felt their position was clear in their response to the petitions.
 - ODOC made it clear that they regarded the matter closed and would not discuss it any further either with Longo or his attorney representation.
 - Again, there was nothing informative within their response to clarify why the proposals were denied.
- **10/29/10 & 12/14/10 - LONGO PURSUES ALTERNATIVES TO MEDIA ATTENTION WITH ODOC**
 - Longo seeks assistance from ODOC to obtain research and other tools to meaningfully continue on organ donation mission and avoid media influence. Denied by Michael Gower on 1/4/11.
